

Following points and changes were discussed and finalized for the BoS of BPES, 2024:

The Under Graduate Degree (BPES) will be either of 3 or 4 year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications.

- I. UG Certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas with minimum 40 credits in two semesters and also, to do another vocational course having theory and practical of 4 credits during summer term or internship/apprenticeship (from 1st June to 30th July) of the first year, in addition to 6 credits from skill based courses earned during first and second semester as required in first year (if already earned 3 credits from second semester then another 3 credits to be earned: with a total 6 credits to be completed from skill based courses during the summer term).
- II. UG Diploma after 2 years of study with required credits and complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vocation of the second year.

In case, student wants to make exit after 1st and 2nd year for UG Certificate (minimum 40 credits) or UG Diploma minimum 80 Credits) after two years, he will communicate the University by 31st March by filling the required Proforma, so that necessary arrangement for doing vocational course and pending skill based course if any, could be made in advance, otherwise the University will not be responsible for the required exit. Internship/Apprenticeships may be carried out in a local firm, local industry or organization or Training in Labs with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEI/research institutions, health allied areas, local governments (such as Panchayats, Municipalities, Parliament or elected representatives, media organizations or any other enterprise), in which students may be engaged with the practical side of the training to help them in employability. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

Semester-wise description of courses:



- A. In the first year in the university, there will be any three Major core courses (DSC mandatory requirement) of 4 credits (may be single discipline specific or Field of Multidisciplinary Courses), and degree is to be awarded on the basis of the course of the study, either single discipline specific as Major Course or Multidisciplinary Courses. The Degree will be awarded in two subjects (Major and Minor). In this University, any three DSCs subjects will be chosen by the student in the first and second semesters. From third semester onwards, students will again have three DSCs of Major (only of same discipline) and 8 credits earned during 1st and 2nd semester in the subjects which were dropped at the end of 2nd semester, when new major was chosen, will be counted towards the stipulated requirement of credits in Minor discipline. From the three discipline studied in the first and second semester, one discipline would be chosen as Major and the second would be chosen as Minor, and third discipline would automatically would become Minor, which actually meant that student has studied four minors in the first two semesters. Special separate Minor will not be studied in the first and second semester which is generally either from the vocational education (skill based) or preferably discipline/ interdisciplinary to have broader understanding beyond the chosen major discipline if the degree is to be awarded in major discipline or related to 50% from Major discipline and 50% from choice of the student, of 4 credits in each semester. For the counting of Minor in a particular discipline, the student has to study single that subject for more than 50% of total minor credits in a degree. He should have 12 credits (Minor) from 24 of three year program and 16 credits from 32 of four year program. Student is allowed to change major or minor at the end of second semester after exploring various courses, but the choice of Major will be within broad discipline. A minimum of 12 credits will be allotted to the Minor stream relating to Vocational Education and Training and these can be related to the Major or Minor discipline or choice of the student and this type of course could be useful to find a job.
- B. Student has to go through 3 introductory level courses related to multi disciplines (MDC) of 9 credits and student has to make the choice of the different disciplines in three different semesters. For each semester, there will be one course of 3 credits. Choice of the multidisciplinary course will be from the basket of MDC courses offered. This course will be away from the student's own domain (other than opted as core discipline(s) known as DSC and not studied in 12th standard). MDC will be taught in 1st, 3rd and 4th semester. MDC are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education i.e. Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Applications, etc. These courses could be helpful for science and social science in data analysis and application of quantitative tools.
- C. All Major or Minor courses DSC will be of 4 credits or as appropriate and an additional one or two credits may be allotted for tutorials or practical.
- D. Again, it is amplified that in the first two semesters, the distribution is Three Discipline Specific Courses (DSCs) of four credits of each with any three subjects to be containing one Major and two minors, but to be finalized in the third semester as per interest of the student or as to be decided



concerned Departments. One Multidisciplinary Course (not chosen in DSC and studied in the 10+2 class), One Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), One Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), and one Value Added Course (VAC). From third semester onwards, students again will have three DSCs as Major of one discipline. A student can decide to continue the chosen major or change the major and minor areas of interest at the end of the second semester, after going through interdisciplinary courses and exploring various courses studied in the first and second semesters. Eight credits earned during 1st and 2nd semester in the subjects studied, which were dropped at the end of 2nd semester, when new major was chosen, will be counted towards the requirement of 24 credits in the Minor subjects. Each student will have to earn 24 (three year UG degree), and 32 (four year UG degree) credits for Minor by qualifying 6 (three years degree), and 8 (four year degree) papers of 4 credits, out of which at least three and four papers as the case may be, must be of a single subject different from his/her major subject and the subject will be called his/her minor subject.

- E. There will be Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) of 8 credits and will be related to languages (MIL and English) and in two years (four semesters), student will do the course of 2 credits in each semester. It will be in 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semester. AEC is to specially emphasize on language and communication skills. The courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills (phonetic), including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills and to prepare for conducting discussions. It will give reflective understanding of the structure and complexity of the language. In Humanities, if the student has chosen Punjabi as DSC, then he or she is not allowed to have Punjabi in AEC. For example, Punjabi/ English will not be allowed to study as DSC and AEC simultaneously in UG program.
- F. There will be Skills Enhancement Courses (SEC) for imparting practical training and skills, handson training, soft skills to enhance the employability of the students. The courses may be designed
 as per the needs of the students and the resources of the university. Total 9 credit courses will be
 in three semesters and each semester is to have one course of 3 credits i.e., 2nd, 3rd, and 4th.
 Student will make a choice of the course from the basket. Internship/ Apprenticeships may be
 carried out in a local firm, local industry or organization or Training in Labs (Research or Analytical
 Laboratories) with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEI/research institutions, allied
 health areas, local government bodies such as Panchayats, Municipalities, Parliament or under
 elected representatives, media organizations or any other enterprise, etc., in which students may
 be engaged with the practical side of the training to help them in employability. It is pertinent to
 mention that DU's syllabus of SEC of English discipline may include Contemporary English
 Language and Literature: Translation & Editing, Business Communication, etc. Concerned
 discipline should be taken into account when deciding SECs.
- G. There will be Value Added Courses (Common to all UG students: VAC) in the first and second semester to make choice from the basket having 3 credit one course in each semester. This course will be beyond the curriculum domain and is to enhance the personality. This will be preferably related to Understanding India, Indian Knowledge System, Environmental Education/ Science, Digital and Technological solutions and Health and Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports and Fitness etc. Choice the course will be decided by the concerned Department. Value Added Courses are



common pool offered by different disciplines and aimed towards personality building, embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional values; promote critical thinking; creative writing, presentation skills, etc., to help in all round development of students. Environmental Education/Science and sustainable development, Indian Knowledge System and Computer Applications should be preferred in UG program as Value Added Courses.

- H. Total credits in the first semester will be minimum 20 and the student is to have 50% credits in Major subjects in each semester. In the second semester, out of minimum total credits of 20, at least 10 credits will be devoted to Major courses. Student is required to have 60 credits in Major (50%) and 24 credits in Minor, if the total credits for 3 year UG is 120 credits and 80 (50%) in 4 year UG in Major with 32 credits in Minor Courses if the total credits are 160. For double major, the student is to earn 48 credits out of 120 credits in a three year degree program and 64 credits out of 160 credits in a four year degree program.
- I. Other activities will include participation in NSS, NCC, NSO, Literacy initiatives and mentoring school initiatives but these will be non-credited of two contact hours for first four or six semesters.
- J. Coding will be based on the learning outcomes, level of difficulty and academic vigor. In the first and second semester known as Foundation or Introductory courses that are intended for students to gain an understanding and basic knowledge about the subjects and help to decide the subject or discipline of interest and may be regarded as the pre-requisites for courses in the major subjects and these courses level will be between 100-199.
- K. The total credits for UG, 1st and 2nd semester would be minimum 40.
- L. Semester 3rd and 4th would be of 24 credits each with 12 credits of Major DSC and 4 credits of Minor with 3 credits of MDC, 2 credits of AEC and 3 credits of SEC. Third and fourth semester known as Intermediate level courses, course level will be between 200-299. These courses will be subject specific courses intended to meet the credit requirements for minor or major areas of learning and part of major and can be pre-requisites for advance level major courses.
- M. 5th and 6th semesters will have 3 Major DSC and 1 Minor courses with 4 credits of each + Internship (with local industry, businesses, artists, craft persons as well as research internships with faculty and researchers at their own or other HEIs/ Research Institutions to induct the students in actual work situations to improve their employability and internship is to be conducted during summer term of eight week) of 4 credits in 5th semester and viva voce of internship will be conducted along with End Term Examination of 5th Semester and one Major Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) of 4 credits in 6th semester with a total of 20 credits each (Three Year UG Program BPES of six semesters with single Majorand with Minor or Double Major in......and). Total Core or Major courses in three year degree undergraduate program would be 15 and six of minor stream. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast track mode to enable students to additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework. In the 5th and 6th semester known as Higher Level Courses it would be between 300-399 and can be called for majoring in a disciplinary area of study for the award of a degree.
- N. UG Degree (Honours) during the 4th and final year, students will undertake advanced level courses in both Major and Minor streams to get UG Degree (Honours).



- O. UG Degree Honours with Research: The students having 75% score in the form of CGPA of 7.5 in all six semesters (Clear pass) may opt for Honours with Research Degree with special field of learning and would take a rigorous research component in Major discipline. Advanced courses would include courses in theory and applied area with practicum, seminar based courses presentation , term papers , research methodology , advanced laboratory experiment / software training , research projects , hand on training , internship/ apprenticeship projects at the undergraduate level . VIII-Semester core major may be seminar based with students' presentations and discussions. [Dissertation/Academic Project/Entrepreneurship which shall commence in 7th semester and conclude in 8th semester. To amplify, 4 credits dissertation (Dissertation-I) will commence in 7th semester and will be completed in 8th semester with of 8 credits dissertation (Dissertation-II). In 7th semester, Dissertation-I related with Major will be evaluated (through DRC committee) on successful submission and finalization of synopsis (i.e., approved Title and Objectives} and review of literature. In 8th semester, Dissertation-II (started in the 7th semester) will be evaluated on successful submission, evaluation and viva-voce examination of Dissertation/Project Report] again through DRC. Again it is being made clear that the courses relating to Honours with Research degree would be research methodology, advanced courses in theory and applied areas and seminar presentations. In the seventh semester Advance level disciplinary /interdisciplinary courses, a course in Research Methodology and a project / dissertation will be conducted. The final semester will be devoted to seminar presentation, preparation and submission of project report/ dissertation related to the topic in the disciplinary or interdisciplinary program. In 7th semester, Research Methodology I - Four credits; Research Ethics and IPR - Four credits] along with other subjects will be taught and the dissertation (Dissertation-I) related to the approved title and objectives will focus on synopsis along with the review of literature. In 8th semester: Research Methodology II - 4 credits; Seminar and Term Paper - Four credits along with other papers will be taken and Dissertation-II will focus on material and methods, results and discussions of the project assigned. Before the presentation of Research Seminar, student will submit abstract of about 150-300 words with 4-6 keywords, and it will be circulated prior to the final seminar to all concerned faculty members and students. Students who make choice for Honours (not research) will have to go through another 12 credits course in Honours in lieu 12 credits research project in Research.
- P. 4th & final year is only for those who want to do UG Degree with Honours or Honours with Research). There will be one year MPES for BPES Honours /Honours with Research students. Four Year under Graduate Program BPES Honours with Research may join Ph.D direct without doing MPES. If someone makes a choice of doing Multidisciplinary Study in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters with three Majors of 4 credits of each, then for obtaining FYUGP Honours degree program, the student will be devoted in the 4th year to the study of only one discipline from the DSCs studied earlier from 1st to 6th semesters as Major, not a combination of three DSCs earlier studied. That student will be awarded Degree in allotted Multidisciplinary Study (Honours) in Major and Minor on the completion of stipulated credits fixed by UGC. Research project work may be published in the peer-reviewed journals or may be presented in conferences / seminars or



may be patented. In the 4year UG Program or First year Post Graduate theoretical and practical courses known as Advanced Courses (PG Diploma), course level will be 400-499. Total number of Core / Major courses in Four Year Under Graduate Degree Program would be 20 and 8 in minor stream.

Q. There can be variation in Credits and Curriculum program framework at the discipline levels. One credit of internship / Field Project means two hour engagement. A key aspect of the internship is induction into actual work situation and on-site experiential learning. Minimum credits framework must be followed. Total duration of UG degree should not go beyond seven years. Learning outcome towards the course / program will accorded through formative assessment such as to be assessed with sessional work i.e class tests, MSEs, home work assignments, practical assignment, Lab reports, individual project reports, seminar presentation, viva voce interviews, closed book and open book tests, computerized adaptive assessment etc as to be decided by the faculty, continuous assessment and terminal examination.

Approximately, 90 % curriculum is changed at UG level under NEP.

At PG Level i.e. MPES, Indian Knowledge System is included under NEP. Approximately, 5% syllabus has been changed in MPES Programs.
